Vision

To create the safest county in England by 2028 by:

- Reducing crime and disorder
- Increasing the number of offenders brought to justice
- Tackling crime and the causes of crime effectively
- Increasing people's feelings of safety
- Providing a robust response to emergencies
- Preventing loss of life due to accidents, both on the roads and in the home

Outcomes

1. Low crime county (Safest in England / Top quartile / top 5%)
2. Offenders have a high expectation of being caught and brought to justice (Sanction detection rates / conviction rates)
3. High quality response to emergencies (Police & Fire response times)
4. Responsive to the needs of local communities (Survey results indicating people feel listened to, understood, police & CDRP's tackle issues of local importance)
5. High levels of reassurance / confidence amongst all communities (Top quartile / top 10% in England feelings of safety)
6. High levels of satisfaction with the service received from the police & partners (Top quartile / top 10% in England measured through satisfaction surveys).
7. Key public places are safe and feel safe e.g. Night time Economy (Indicators to be developed with CDRP's & Local Authorities)
8. High confidence levels in dealing with serious criminality and major events/incidents (Measured through satisfaction surveys).
9. Safe roads in the county (top quartile in England in terms of KSI's)
10. Low perceptions of drug dealing (Top 5% in England)

Further outcomes to be developed to reflect the work of the Fire Service, CDRP's and other partners in achieving the vision set out above.
