SUBJECT: Performance Clinic – The Children’s Trust Delivery Partnership

KEY ISSUES:

The Children’s Trust Delivery Partnership brings together all organisations that provide services or support to children and young people in Suffolk. Through identifying where work can be done more effectively together than alone, the partnership aims to improve what is done and achieve the national aim “to make this the best place in the world for our children and young people to grow up”.

The main focus of discussion today will be pupil attainment, reducing the number of young people not in education, employment or training (NEET), and Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAMHS).
